

1) Introduction

The Centenary Cup is a major golfing event for Port Kembla Golf Club. The conditions of play have been set down by the Match Committee so that all players have a fair and equitable chance to compete for the Centenary Cup.

2) Description of Play

- The Centenary Cup is a 2 Ball Scramble (Ambrose)
- Nett prizes take precedence over Gross.
- Men will play from the Blue tees.
- Women will play from the Gold tees.
- The Match Committee reserves the right to alter any description of play conditions.

3) Administration and Entry.

3.1 Eligibility

- The Centenary Cup is a members only event.
- Pairs must contain a 7 Day or Equivalent, Intermediate+, Intermediate or Junior member.

4) Championship Conditions

4.1 General

- The Centenary Cup is a Nett Stroke event with the Centenary Cup Winners being determined by the lowest Nett 18 hole stroke total.
- The team handicap will be the sum of the playing partner's daily handicaps, divided by 4.
- Each pairing must use a minimum of 7 (seven) tee shots per player – Failure to use 7 (seven) tee shots per player will result in disqualification. Shots to be marked on scorecard.
- The selected ball is to be played from its true position. If relief is permitted, the selected ball will be played from the location it comes to rest.
- Playing partners are to play their ball from within 1 (one) club length of the selected ball, unless the ball is on the green when they will play their ball within 10cm of the selected ball.
- If the selected ball lies in the fairway, the partner must play from the fairway.
- If the selected ball lies in the rough, the partner must play from the rough.
- If the selected ball lies in a bunker, the partner must play from the bunker.
- If the selected ball lies in a hazard and relief is not sought, the partner must play from the hazard.
- If the selected ball lies in the fairway, the partner's ball may be placed.
- If the selected ball lies in the rough, a bunker or a penalty area the partner's ball must be dropped.

4.2 Ties and Count-backs

All ties in the Centenary Cup will be determined by standard count back procedure.

4.3 Scoring

Digital scoring of the Centenary Cup is not permitted.

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
